In 2018, DC Sail successfully transitioned to operating out of two separate marina locations. Our new facility at Diamond Teague Park Piers, where we host our adult and youth programs, and also remaining a feature at The Wharf, where "American Spirit" schooner operations continue to be managed.

Many thanks to our members, volunteers, schooner guests, donors, sponsors, Board of Directors and our staff for your support!

Although we had record-breaking rainfall totals this season which resulted in the cancellation of several events, we still had a great year! For example, we hosted 240 campers, a sell out to capacity fall season of High School Racing, 173 new adult students, and maintained our historical membership

levels. The rain caused significant loss of income for DC Sail, but we closed out the year with much to be grateful for and look forward a bright and promising future!

Each year DC Sail's Youth Scholarship Program provides numerous deserving children their participation in our summer camps and other programs, at little to no cost to their families. Scholarship recipients typically hail from an array of adverse conditions which would otherwise prevent these youngsters the opportunity to explore the beauty of sail due to financial restrictions and other circumstances. It is only with our year-around fundraising initiatives to secure supplemental income that we are able to provide this deep outreach and service to the community. # Youth Programs—Kids Set Sail

Kids Set Sail serves as our longest running Youth Sailing Program at DC Sail. During the week-long summer camp, the young sailors are provided with instruction on how to sail a boat with each participant rotating through the skipper and crew positions. The 4:1 ratio of campers to counselor on board the boat provides excellent hands-on experience.

# Youth Programs—High School Racing

The High School Racing Program has been offered at DC Sail for many years, and has grown to more than 75 participants in both spring and fall. Representing 30+ area public and private schools, middle and high school aged children attend practice two to three times weekly and compete in local and regional regattas. DC Sail is the sole outlet for competitive High School Racing in the Washington area.

The boat is available for Private & Educational Charters, and hosts ticketed public events. Ticketed events include:


- Cherry Blossom cruises (day and evening).






