Dear Friends:

2019 was a very exciting year for DC Sail!

Our Summer Camp program, Kids Set Sail, and both seasons of High School Racing sold out to capacity for the second year.

In 2019, DC Sail partnered with The Brendan Foundation to

launch a pilot program for youth sailors with learning differences. Children, along with

staff explored the beauty of sailing during multiple weeks of after school programming on our Flying Scot fleets. We look forward to hosting this wonderful program again in 2020.

In September, DC Sail was Appointed As a Primary Siebel Sailors Program Regional Facility by US Sailing. We are only one of three in the United States with this notable designation! The Siebel Sailors Program will provide addi-



tional outreach into the community to provide sailing lessons to youth of families that are considered economically-challenged. Through this program, DC Sail will actively create a strong foundation for a more diverse community of sailing in Washington, DC.



In our Adult programs, we helped nearly 200 participants to learn to sail and obtain their US Sailing Small Boat Sailing certifications. Another 20 members also took advantage of our Intro to FJs Course, and increased their sailing knowledge, skills, and learned how competitively race!

Each year DC Sail's Youth Scholarship Program provides numerous deserving children their participation in our summer camps and other programs, at little to no cost to their families. With the generosity of a wonderful \$25,000 grant issued to us from The Kahlert Foundation, we were also able to provide 180 children with sailing and boating safety experiences.

Scholarship recipients typically hail from an array of adverse conditions which would otherwise prevent these youngsters the opportunity to explore the beauty of sail due to financial restrictions and other circumstances. It is only with our year-around fundraising initiatives to secure supplemental income that we are able to provide this deep outreach and service to the community. We're so very grateful for your continued support of DC Sail—thank you!

Youth Programs—Kids Set Sail

Kids Set Sail serves as our longest running Youth Sailing Program at DC Sail. During the week-long summer camp, the young sailors are provided with instruction on how to sail a boat with each participant rotating through the skipper and crew positions. The 4:1 ratio of campers to counselor on board the boat provides excellent hands-on experience.

Curriculum Includes:

- Steering
- Weather and Electricity Talk

- Example Learn how to navigate a race course
- Safety Position
- Currents & Tides

Youth Programs—High School Racing

The High School Racing Program has been offered at DC Sail for many years, and has grown to more than 70 participants in both spring and fall. Representing 30+ area public and private schools, middle and high school aged children attend practice two to three times weekly and compete in local and regional regattas. DC Sail is the sole outlet for competitive High School Racing in the Washington area.














DC SAIL American spirit

The boat is available for Private & Educational Charters, and hosts ticketed public events. Ticketed events include:


- Cherry Blossom cruises (day and evening).




